







5. Do you think the farming and killing of wild animals for clothing and fashion accessories is acceptable?




6. Do you think that feathers can be collected from birds like ostriches without causing harm to them?



7. Do you know how ostriches are farmed and slaughtered for their feathers and skin?




8. Did you know that birds must be captured from the wild or intensively farmed and slaughtered for feathers to be used in fashion?





# 9. Knowing that Ostriches must be killed to collect their feathers, how likely are you to avoid feathers in fashion?






11. Do you think that animal-derived leather can be sourced without harming cows?





### 12. Do you think that animal-derived leather can be sustainably sourced?





## 13. Do you think that animal-derived leather is biodegradable and environmentally sustainable?



14. Do you think that animal-derived leather is a by-product of the meat industry?






# 16. Knowing that the leather industry contributes to the cruel farming and killing of cows, how likely are you to avoid leather?




18. If sustainable, animal-free leather alternatives were readily available, would you prefer them over cow skin leather?


